## **STM Youth Social Media Survey**

In our day and age, nearly every teen uses some form of social media on a regular basis. Social media is an amazing tool of communication, but as with all other technology, it is important to be aware of the risks — especially when it comes to our children.

In the Spring of 2015, nearly 70 high school students from STM participated in an informal survey of what STM teens use for social media.

## **OUR FINDINGS:**

- Almost ALL used TEXTING as their primary communication.
- YouTube is the most popular internet site (used by nearly 100% of our teens).
- Instagram & SnapChat are the most popular social media apps.
- Twitter has the 3rd highest usage among our teens.
- The social media app Vine edged out Facebook use.
- Tumblr and Pinterest are also moderately used.
- The apps on the bottom of the list are also worth noting:
  - Wanelo, Reddit, Ask.fm, Whisper, Google+ and YO are used by only a handful
    of our teens -- <u>but they ARE in use</u>.
- Not used by the surveyed teens in 2015:
  - o Kik Messenger, WhatsApp, Yik Yak, and Omegle.

## WHY DO PARENTS NEED TO KNOW THIS?

Many of the most popular apps used by our kids have safety risks:

- Instagram, Snapchat and texting can be used for bullying, sexting, and sending other inappropriate or embarrassing pictures.
- Vine has funny content, but most is inappropriate for kids
- Ask.fm lets users ask & answer anonymous questions; on Whisper users share "confessional" secrets.
  - Both Ask.fm and Whisper contain creepy and dark content and have been linked to cyberbullying and teen suicides.
- It is GOOD NEWS that our teens don't use Yik Yak a location based app that circulates anonymous rumors, opinions, bullying, and explicit content to any user within 1.5 miles of your location. This app has been banned by many schools.
